Admissions Requirements

Candidates need to:

- ✓ Complete the Cambridge International Certificate in Teaching and Learning (Module 1).
- ✓ Complete Module 2 of the Cambridge International Diploma in Teaching and Learning.
- Be a full- or part-time teacher employed in an educational institution such as a school, college, university, or adult training centre.
- Teach in their current school over a full academic year, for a minimum of 24 weeks and a minimum of six hours per week.
- Teach a group with a minimum of six learners.
- Be responsible for planning, teaching, and formatively assessing groups of learners.
- Have English language competence comparable to Level B2 in the CEFR or a minimum requirement of 5.5 on the IELTS.
